Funding available for frontline charities and organizations supporting vulnerable residents through United Way Simcoe Muskoka and the Emergency Community Support Fund

United Way Simcoe Muskoka is accepting funding applications for the Emergency Community Support Fund (ECSF). The fund provides financial support to charities and other qualified donees adapting their frontline services to support vulnerable Canadians during the COVID-19 pandemic. The ECSF was announced by the Government of Canada and is administered in collaboration with United Way Centraide Canada, Community Foundations of Canada and the Canadian Red Cross.

ECSF funding distributed by United Way Simcoe Muskoka will make sure vital services continue and new services are made available so that no one is left behind as we endure this pandemic.

Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis until July 24, 2020. Local community service organizations within Simcoe Muskoka that provide rapid, emergency community support to vulnerable residents are encouraged to apply for funding.

"The needs of our most vulnerable are more pressing than ever, and our local organizations—charities, nonprofits and others—are doing their best to meet these needs.
