Poverty increased 1% in 2022 from 2021

State of Poverty

Across Canada 1 in 14 (or 2.8 million people) live below the poverty line

42,653 (8%) in Simcoe County 8,145 (10%) in District of Muskoka 845 (9%) in Town of The Blue Mountains



7,110 (6%) children living in poverty

6,928 (25%) lone parent families with kids under age18 are living in low income






Median hourly wage in Canada - 2022 constant dollars




How Much Income is Needed for Food and Rent









Over 132,769 in Simcoe, Muskoka and TBM reside in unaffordable housing



Energy Poverty




What is it? When a household spends more than 6% on home energy services, they are experiencing energy poverty.

12,000 low income Ontarians served annually by United Way Simcoe Muskoka's energy assistance program




In 2022 the average bill was \$1,969.83.

Childcare


115,540 Childcare aged population in our region

Childcare



- Childcare fee reductions began on April 1 2022
- Rise in work from home arrangements
- Easing of COVID-19 pandemic
- Greater pressure on household budgets due to elevated inflation and higher interest rates

People self-reporting their health is "good" or "excellent" is 71%




Self-Rated Mental Health (2021)


