The first building will be utilized as a kitchen and food storage area while the second building will be utilized as a dining and group room. Includes capital funds to finish 6 residential units. This capital project (Mixed Model Facility) was previously funded for the acquisition and renovation of the property which was intended to be used as a mixed-model of office and housing space.</p>	<p>Brockville</p>
<p>Mind-Aid</p>	<p>Continuation of the System Navigation/Support/Outreach - Homelessness Prevention in Vulnerable Youth project. United Way of Bruce Grey	Continuation of the The Good Knights Sleep project, which assists with rental arrears, delivery costs for free furnishings or moving expenses, as well as mattresses, bedding and more.	Owen Sound
United Way Perth-Huron	Expansion to current project (United Way Perth Huron Connection Centres) which supports staff wages at 3 different connection centres (Stratford, Exeter, and St. Mary's). In Exeter, there will be a focus on staffing supports around food security and housing stability. In Stratford, the staff will focus on mental health and addiction (MHA), housing placement and stability, and connection to services such as counseling, legal aid, and health services, serving homeless or precariously housed individuals. Extension funds will also cover support for staff wages at the Northern Huron Connection Centre, as well as staffing to oversee the regional connection centres.
