Organization	Project Description	Location
Perth County Transition Home for Women	This project includes two components: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Replacing the current main kitchen with a new, updated, and functional kitchen.</li> <li>2. Purchasing a minivan to deliver housing stability services to their rural community. The van will allow staff to accompany women to view units, meet landlords, provide support to maintain housing, help people keep their current housing, and prevent homelessness.</li> </ol>	Perth County & City of Stratford
Habitat for Humanity Ontario Gateway North <i>(New)</i>	This project will include six newly constructed long-term, affordable, supportive housing units, planned for vulnerable people at imminent risk of homelessness.	Muskoka Region
United Way Perth Huron/United Housing	United Housing's project is the repurposing of the former McDonald's Music Hall in downtown Listowel to create 10 mixed-use rental housing units, including 3 deeply affordable units. This 4,500 sq. ft. space will be transformed into 10 apartments, along with two ground-floor commercial units, by 2026	North Perth
YWCA St. Thomas- Elgin	This project involves the continued development and construction of Project Tiny Hope in St. Thomas-Elgin. It includes the building of 40 tiny homes, gardens, a playground, parking, and an amenities pad. This new property will provide enhanced services to support vulnerable populations through the YWCA St. Thomas-Elgin.	St. Thomas-Elgin
Safe N' Sound Residence	This project involves purchasing a facility that will be retrofitted and converted from a daycare into a shelter.	Grey and Bruce Counties
City of Cornwall <i>(New)</i>	The Massey Commons project will convert a former school into much-needed community housing, offering 22 barrier-free apartments—3 two-bedroom units and 19 studios—for supportive housing. The renovated building will blend with the surrounding neighborhood and include amenities like a community garden to foster a supportive environment. The design also includes office space for the Housing Rapid Response Team and shared space for community organizations to provide wraparound supports.	Cornwall, Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry

Naandwechige-Gamig Wikwemikong Health Centre	This project provides individualized support to help participants navigate the complex process of securing permanent housing. Services include assistance with housing applications, resume development, and referrals for mental health, and financial aid. The program also offers essential items such as food and hygiene supplies to meet basic needs.	Wikwemikong
Temiskaming Native Women's Support Group	This project provides housing stability resources and support to Indigenous Peoples experiencing or at risk of homelessness. It includes assessing individual needs and offering navigation assistance to access basic necessities, apply for financial aid, and connect with other service providers. To help prevent eviction, the Indigenous Housing Worker (IHW) mediates landlord conflicts and provides information and referrals for legal support related to tenancy issues. M'Wikwedong Native Cultural Resource Centre	This project connects youth with appropriate programs and services available through M'Wikwedong, as well as external supports. Additionally, the project includes hiring a part-time Social Worker with experience working with youth, particularly those with complex backgrounds. Funding will support the delivery of activities such as money management and budgeting, life skills (including personal care, meal preparation, laundry, and health/medical/dental care), and expanded cultural land-based programming,	Owen Sound, Grey and Bruce Counties
Mamaweswen, the North Shore Tribal Council <i>(New)</i>	This project involves hiring supportive housing facilitators to manage 35 units at an Indigenous-led, land-based housing facility.	Mamaweswen
Kapuskasing Indian Friendship Centre <i>(New)</i>	This project will supply non-perishable food items for a community pantry and host congregate meals and meal-prepping sessions. Additionally, we will purchase personal hygiene and essential items to support community members.	Kapuskasing
Whitefish River First Nation <i>(New)</i>	The Wiidookaadyok Housing Initiative supports individuals in securing and maintaining housing, and preventing homelessness by: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Providing essential start-up items like groceries, hygiene products, bedding, and furniture.</li> <li>2. Helping with basic utility bills, including heating and electricity.</li> <li>3. Assisting with rental arrears to prevent eviction.</li> <li>4. Offering educational awareness programs.</li> </ol>	Whitefish River First Nation & Birch Island



Shelter link Youth Services	The Housing First program addresses youth homelessness in Perth County by providing stable housing as a foundation for long-term independence. In Shelter Care, it offers individualized assessments, rapid rehousing, and wrap-around supports such as case management, mental health and wellness services, life skills training, and community resource referrals. Transition House Coalition of Northumberland	Dine with Dignity is a new initiative addressing food security, skill-building, and cultural needs for individuals and families experiencing or at risk of homelessness. It will provide fresh, high-quality groceries to support nutritious, culturally relevant meals, including foods aligned with Canada's Food Guide and ingredients from our Indigenous Medicinal and Food Garden. The second component of this project is the launch of the Ride with Respect program, which will improve access to essential services and support long-term stability through reliable transportation. A Toyota Rear Ramp Wheelchair-Accessible Sienna LE Hybrid will be purchased to provide safe and inclusive travel.	Northumberland County
Elizabeth Fry Society Simcoe Muskoka	Muskoka Community Programs address housing security and homelessness prevention through the Muskoka Youth Trusteeship Program and delivery of core Community Programs, including Emotions Management, Grief and Loss, Anti-Theft, Healthy Relationships, Substance Use and Harm Reduction, and Safe Independent Choices. Belleville & Quinte West Community Health Centre	This project involves an Outreach Worker who connects QW community members experiencing or at risk of homelessness to low-barrier, intensive case management support to improve health outcomes and promote health equity. The Outreach Worker also facilitates system navigation and links clients to existing services (e.g., primary care, addiction and mental health services, housing, income supports, meal programs, etc.). Northumberland United Way <i>(New)</i>	<p><b>Haven for All</b> is a comprehensive initiative addressing gaps in services for individuals experiencing or at risk of homelessness. Mind-Aid	This project involves a System Navigator dedicated to working with at-risk youth, assessing their challenges and circumstances, and determining a personalized pathway forward that aligns with their individual needs and goals. The Navigator fosters wrap-around care by facilitating supported connections to a variety of services and resources, building flexible, client-led, ongoing relationships that provide tailored support. Community YWCA of Muskoka	The Circles program supports individuals at risk of homelessness by providing matched peer support through a Coach, Coordinator, and trained volunteers. Weekly meetings include meals, childcare, transportation subsidies, and activities that offer wraparound support. Participants (Leaders) are paired with Allies to identify and work toward personal goals for sustainable livelihoods.	District Municipality of Muskoka
Next Step Housing Connection	The Quinte West Intensive Case Management (QW ICM) program offers one-on-one housing support to individuals and families facing homelessness. Using a Housing First approach, clients are quickly placed in safe, stable, long-term housing. The Case Manager also provides housing counseling, budgeting support, and assistance with transportation, viewings, negotiations, furniture acquisition, and moving as needed.	Quinte West
United Way Perth Huron	The Stratford, Northern Huron, and Southern Huron Connection Centres offer wrap-around support to individuals experiencing homelessness, precarious housing, or vulnerability by linking them to housing, medical, financial, and legal services. Staff provide trauma-informed care, substance use, and mental health support. Following Housing First principles, the Centres deliver client-centered, voluntary services that meet basic needs, build trust, and coordinate care across multiple providers, respecting each individual's unique journey.
