United Way Perth Huron/United Housing	Phase 2 of United Housing’s North Perth Music Hall Apartments project involves repurposing the former McDonald’s Music Hall in downtown Listowel to create 10 mixed-use rental housing units, including three deeply affordable units. The 4,500-square-foot space will be transformed into 10 apartments and two ground-floor commercial units by 2026.	North Perth
The District Municipality of Muskoka	The Muskoka Transitional Housing Project will develop five to ten modular, self-contained studios, one-, or two-bedroom units for transitional housing on a District-owned property at the northeast corner of Hanes Road.	District of Municipality of Muskoka
Temiskaming Native Women's Support Group	This project will establish three one-bedroom emergency shelter units to offer an alternative shelter option to Indigenous Peoples who are at risk of or experiencing homelessness. The emergency shelter units alleviate the barriers experienced by Indigenous Peoples within the shelter system as it offers greater privacy and personal space for the user and improves their sense of safety and security. Niigaaniin Services	Renovations to the existing transitional housing facility: Funding will enhance the program by upgrading 28 one-bedroom mobile units into safe, functional transitional housing suites. Improvements will enhance energy efficiency and functionality, including plumbing, heating, and electrical systems, to reduce operating costs.	Robinson Huron Treaty Area
Community Living Huntsville	Renovations, upgrades, and repairs to an existing facility. Several key areas—including bathrooms, bedrooms, accessibility features, and communal spaces—need urgent repair or redesign. This includes mold remediation, electrical and roof repairs, and renovations to create self-contained units, as well as required professional and technical fees (design, engineering, permits, and inspections). The renovation will include 3-4 self contained units as well as an emergency bedroom for short term assistance.	Huntsville
The INN St. Thomas - Elgin	Purchase of Operational Equipment and Supplies: Hydration stations, commercial washer and dryer, stainless steel security table, fence boards, cordless scrubbing system, air purifiers, portable air conditioner with heater, stainless steel wall-mounted handwash sink, and slip-resistant mats. The Local Community Food Centre	The Nourish Access Market expansion and redesign will improve access to affordable, nutritious food for individuals and families experiencing or at risk of homelessness. Funds will support essential infrastructure, including shelving, rolling stock units, refrigeration, and a dedicated entrance, enabling longer hours, more consistent inventory, and greater accessibility. Expanded space and shopping carts will also improve access for people with mobility challenges. These upgrades will reduce barriers, increase dignity and choice, and create a more welcoming, reliable food-shopping experience.	Stratford
John Howard Society of the Kawarthas	Funding will support the creation of a six-bed transitional housing unit adjacent to the Community Integrated Care Hub (CICH), providing a safe, stable, and trauma-informed environment for individuals requiring short-term accommodation while working toward long-term housing solutions. Funds will also enhance the shared outdoor space with a privacy fence, storage shed, garden beds for land-based programming, including a Three Sisters Garden, and two covered seating areas for individuals accessing services or awaiting overnight accommodation. Naandwechige-Gamig Wikwemikong Health Centre	This project provides individualized support to help participants navigate the complex process of securing permanent housing. Services include assistance with housing applications, resume development, and referrals for mental health, and financial aid. Temiskaming Native Women's Support Group	This project provides housing stability resources and support to Indigenous Peoples experiencing or at risk of homelessness. It includes assessing individual needs and offering navigation assistance to access basic necessities, apply for financial aid, and connect with other service providers. To help prevent eviction, the Indigenous Housing Worker (IHW) mediates landlord conflicts and provides information and referrals for legal support related to tenancy issues. M'Wikwedong Native Cultural Resource Centre	This project connects youth with appropriate programs and services available through M'Wikwedong, as well as external supports. Shelter link Youth Services	The Housing First program addresses youth homelessness in Perth County by providing stable housing as a foundation for long-term independence. In Shelter Care, it offers individualized assessments, rapid rehousing, and wrap-around supports such as case management, mental health and wellness services, life skills training, and community resource referrals. Transition House Coalition of Northumberland	Dine with Dignity is a new initiative addressing food security, skill-building, and cultural needs for individuals and families experiencing or at risk of homelessness. It will provide fresh, high-quality groceries to support nutritious, culturally relevant meals, including foods aligned with Canada's Food Guide and ingredients from our Indigenous Medicinal and Food Garden. The second component of this project is the launch of the Ride with Respect program, which will improve access to essential services and support long-term stability through reliable transportation. Northumberland United Way	Haven for All is a comprehensive initiative addressing gaps in services for individuals experiencing or at risk of homelessness. It encompasses: • Feed: Providing access to essential groceries and hygiene items. • House: Offering financial assistance to help secure long-term housing. • Learn: Delivering educational and skill-building workshops, including classes on budgeting, cooking, and other essential life skills. • Engage: Funding community engagement and social activities, such as sports, games, and outings, to foster social connections for those living in shelter. Mind-Aid	This project involves a System Navigator dedicated to working with at-risk youth, assessing their challenges and circumstances, and determining a personalized pathway forward that aligns with their individual needs and goals. The Navigator fosters wrap-around care by facilitating supported connections to a variety of services and resources, building flexible, client-led, ongoing relationships that provide tailored support. Community YWCA of Muskoka	The Circles program supports individuals at risk of homelessness by providing matched peer support through a Coach, Coordinator, and trained volunteers. Weekly meetings include meals, childcare, transportation subsidies, and activities that offer wraparound support. United Way Perth Huron	The Stratford, Northern Huron, and Southern Huron Connection Centres offer wrap-around support to individuals experiencing homelessness, precarious housing, or vulnerability by linking them to housing, medical, financial, and legal services. Staff provide trauma-informed care, substance use, and mental health support. Following Housing First principles, the Centres deliver client-centered, voluntary services that meet basic needs, build trust, and coordinate care across multiple providers, respecting each individual's unique journey.
